The Richmond Peace Festival is honored to celebrate our 13th year with the theme "Lift Every Voice"! Our mission is to bring the City of Richmond together to honor our rich diversity through entertainment, education and peace building. Every year we produce a series of activities for youth and adults, from performances and games to crafts and workshops that will foster a deeper understanding of community.

Led by the belief that 'Peace Begins at Home', the RVA Peace Festival brings together over 9 faith traditions including Baha'i, Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Jew, Muslim, Sikh, non-faith and numerous other cultures to encourage families to learn that we have far more in common than we do differences. Now more than ever, creating a greater truly diverse and safe community is needed in the Richmond area. We strive to bring awareness and education around issues of racism, Islamophobia, xenophobia, and the many "isms" that prevent people from being treated with dignity and pride.

HISTORY

The seeds for the Richmond Peace Festival were planted during a candlelight vigil following the tragic events of 9/11. Muslims wondered what repercussions might befall them as an aftermath to the events of that tragedy. In the dusk of evening, Muslims and others gathered for a candlelight service on the front lawn of the Islamic Center. They were surprised and grateful when a candlelight procession of members from a neighboring church, Bon Air United Methodist Church, joined the vigil. Those in the procession had come to provide comfort and to pray for those lost in the tragedy of 9/11. This was one of many such stories of extraordinary courage and love following 9/11, and it was to grow into Richmond's "answer" to 9/11.



The RVA Peace Festival will take place Saturday, September 10, 2016, at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Richmond, 11am to 5pm.

RVA Peace Festival is a celebration of the diverse faith and cultural traditions that enrich our region.

This year's Festival, the 12th annual, will feature new and exciting elements! Enjoy performances from Ezibu Muntu, the Latin Ballet of Virginia, Richmond Boys Choir, Sri Sai Dance Academy, and Falun Dafa Chinese Dancers. Children will enjoy Chalk for Peace by Art 180 and teen-led cooperative games. All will have the chance to walk through a meditation labyrinth and experience workshops.

The theme of the 2014 RVA Peace Festival, held on September 13, was "Faith and the Environment." In spite of a rainy day, attendees braved the weather to hear a panel presentation on faith responses to climate change. The panelists, representing Islam, Hinduism and Christianity, were united in their views that humanity has a spiritual responsibility to be good stewards of this planet and that we have a moral obligation to take positive steps to address the effects of climate change.
